Gathering all generations to pray for all nations, asking God to do what only He can do, and doing whatever He asks of us.

This is the last article in a series looking more closely at the statements of the ASK Network vision and ways to practically implement them on the local level. The primary work of ASK Network is to gather to pray. The ASK model for prayer is to seek the Lord for a prayer target and

scripture, worship, meditate on the scripture, and pray out what the Lord has given you ASKing Him to do what He has shown you to ASK of Him. While the ministry of intercession is usually in the intimate, secluded place with God, there are times when the Lord moves on our hearts to put feet to our prayers.

Here are some examples of what God has asked us to do:

- Prayer-walking. Many of us have prayer-walked around schools, college campuses, county courthouses, government buildings, and neighborhoods. Prayer-walking has been defined as praying on site with insight.
- Prayer drives. Sometimes the area for which we have been praying is too large to be prayer-walked, so we pray as we drive around the borders of a city, county or state.
- Prayer mapping. You may be lead to research the history of your city or state in order to pray with better understanding.
- Taking a stand for justice. "As those who pray, we tune into what offends the heart of God. We need to
 be prepared to take a stand for what He stands for. Be listening to the Lord to hear anything He might
 speak to you to do about the very issues of injustice you perceive, and then act accordingly."*
- Opening hands of mercy. 'Prayer is a mercy ministry, taking the needs of others to heart. As our hearts are open to be merciful in prayer we will be led to be merciful in our actions." * For example, as we pray for a nation, we may be led to support missionary work there.
- Teaching a short two to four week course on the ASKing model of worship/meditation/prayer in your church, or asking another to join you (or your prayer group) in asking prayer.
- Contacting your pastor or leaders in your community and ask how you can pray for them.

As we pray may we hear what the Spirit of God is speaking to our hearts as we ASK.
